


### About this exhibition:

"Burhi Aiir Xadhu" or Grandma's Tales are folktales from Assam that have been passed down generations. Most children in Assam grew up listening to these stories and fondly cherish them as indelible parts of their childhood. In 1911, the renowned Assamese writer and poet Lakshminath Bezboruah, also called 'Sahityarathi', was the first person to formally compile many such folktales into the now iconic book "Burhi Aiir Xadhu"; thus cementing their place in Assamese culture for perpetuity. This exhibition is the artist's tribute to the great Sahityarathi and these iconic stories.

For over a decade, Dr Deepali Kayal has recreated the magic of these folktales through her paintings. The works shown here have been exhibited in multiple shows in India and internationally and received immense praise for their eloquent and sincere narration of Assam's cultural richness. More recently, the artist has also given them a fresh voice through illustrated childrens' books and comics.
